INTRODUCTION

So you think you can run the Country? Well if the past performances of previous Prime Ministers are anything to go by, you probably could.

There are three very simple rules to being a successful Prime Minister.

1.Listen to your constituents and the general public

(They know what the country wants)

(They are the ones who will vote you in)

This is a serious breach of rule number three.

If you still think you can make a better job of running the Country than all the previous Prime Ministers put together then read on.

The Ten Commandments

To follow if you want to run the Country

1. **Shall be able to connect with their constituents-** A Prime Minister will instinctively connect with their constituents. If they have failed as a leader it's probably because they didn't connect.
2. **Shall have a full grasp of domestic issues-** A good Prime Minister has to have a keen understanding of domestic concerns that directly impact his people. Failure to understand and deal with these issues will almost certainly create a gap between what the leader does and how it affects his People.
3. **Shall have a clear vision-** The Prime Minister who knows their vision and can successfully articulate it to the voting public is one who will be highly respected.
4. **Shall understand the different cultures in their Country-** A good Prime Minister will understand the different cultures within their Country. A good Prime Minister must be able to appeal to them all in both good and bad times.

5. **Shall be respected but approachable-** This is important. A good Prime Minister has to be able to remain distinct, as a symbol for their nation. Yet, they must not be aloof or too distant. They must be approachable. A Great Prime Minister must be a unique individual, respected by us, but they must be able to be embraced by us.
6. **Shall have good credibility-** The best Prime Minister will maintain good credibility with their people. For example when the Prime Minister stands for one thing like giving us the referendum on the EU, he must have that credibility with his people that says, "I will do as I promised."
7. **Shall be a good Leader-** A good Prime Minister will have good leadership qualities and prove that he can manage his team effectively, he will choose only the most competent ones. He will work hard and delegate responsibilities effectively.
8. **Shall have a good grasp of parliamentary constituents-** A good Prime Minister will understand the needs of their own political party and the opposition parties. He must listen and negotiate within his own party and with the opposition parties.
9. **Shall have great foreign power presence-** The Prime Minister must be able to communicate with heads of state and be strong enough to maintain healthy and proactive relationships with those nations. The new Prime Minister must share the vision that will invariably lead to cooperation

with other nations. If the Prime Minister is seen as weak by foreign nations, they will ride roughshod over us, just like they are doing at the moment.

10. **Shall be a Great Politician-** When the Prime Minister has to face elections they must be able to go out into their constituency and convince their public to re-elect them. They will only do this if the Prime Minister has kept all of his original pre-election promises and has not reneged on any of them particularly the one that promised a referendum on the EU.

CHAPTER 1

Problems To Be Solved

Before you can run the Country successfully you will have a lot of things to sort out! Don't forget that we have been on a downward spiral for many years and it is your job to make Britain Great again.

The biggest bone of contention is our membership of the EU. We must have thought it was a good idea at the time in 1973 to join the Common Market. The electorate supported EEC membership in 1975 by 67 percent, but that was then and this is now. I'm sure everyone agrees that waiting thirty-seven years is by far too long.

We need a Prime Minister who will give the people the right to decide their fate. The way things are at the moment this is more like a dictatorship than a democracy.

- Immigration is out of control and we don't have enough housing, hospitals or schools.
- Crime is at an all time high yet our valuable police force had their budgets cut and their numbers reduced.

- Our country is often under threat from other countries yet our defence budgets are being cut and our Armed Forces are being reduced.
- In many schools the English language is in the minority with Asian and Eastern European languages being in the majority.
- The government must stop mothers from thinking that producing babies is a moneymaking scheme.
- Parents must be held accountable for their children. Too many are delinquents because the parents just can't be bothered.
- Translation costs us a fortune but why should we bother? There's not another country in the world that would translate documents for free!
- There are ten simple steps to improve the quality of life in Great Britain and they are as follows:
 1. Get us out of the EU
 2. STOP immigration for 5 years then closely monitor it thereafter
 3. Abolish the Human Rights Law
 4. Limit child benefit to the first two children
 5. Insist that all migrants learn to speak English within 6 months

6. Increase prison sentences and make them serve the full term
7. Curb spending on Foreign Aid we have enough homeless and sick here
8. Stop sending benefits abroad especially pensions & child benefit
9. Send home all failed assylum seekers immediately
10. Do not allow 'Hate Preachers' in and expell any that are already here

IMMIGRATION IS OUT OF CONTROL AND THE CAUSE OF MOST OF OUR PROBLEMS.

Everyone knows this, everyone that is but the current Prime Minister, because if he did know he would surely do something about.

First and foremost we must leave the EU if we weren't a part of the EU we wouldn't have to accept all the asylum seekers and immigrants, legal or otherwise that they insist we take in.

Last year 474,500 migrants came to Great Britain that equates to 1,300 per day we cannot possibly be expected to take in so many. Worse still immigrants are the main cause of the rise in crime. Last year 250 foreign criminals were allowed to stay and a further 409 foreign criminals won their right to stay after appeal.

Included in this number were at least four terrorists, eight killers and rapists, twenty robbers, eight pedophile's and four people convicted of firearms offences. Why do we allow this? In 2009 there were approximately 141,000 serving police officers. Since then the Government saw fit to reduce the Police budget, close police stations and reduce staffing. Where is the logic in that? At the rate the population is growing criminals already outnumber the police by about 4 to 1.

We should recruit more police officers and open more stations, not the opposite. The money wasted in foreign aid should go towards this to make it happen.

Once you take us out of the EU you must set up proper border controls with asylum centers where asylum seekers are held until their claim is processed. In accordance with the true meaning of asylum we shouldn't get asylum seekers, as Great Britain is not by any stretch of the imagination the first safe haven. All who fail should be deported immediately without any right to appeal.

Immigrants have to prove they can support themselves. They must have a sponsor, a place to live and a job to go to. We must make it very clear that no benefits will be paid out until the migrant lives and works legally for at least two years, and that includes child benefits. We must not be seen as a soft touch any longer.

Immigration is named as the primary cause of a dramatic increase of over 20.5 million visits to Accident and Emergency (A&E) departments last year. This equates to approximately 40 percent of the entire population of Great Britain. This shows an increase of 5 percent in one year.

A&E attendances have increased considerably since mass immigration has speeded up. Experts ascribed the increase to GP out-of-hours rules. Immigrants are confused over GP out-of-hours services and tend to visit A&E routinely and not register with family doctors. In inner cities and particularly London, immigrants visit A&E instead of GPs. Figures also show that elderly British people, who require A&E services in greater proportion, are being shoved aside by the flood of foreigners. The rise is real and must be recognised. We have a

growing ageing population and more elderly are coming into the emergency departments. Yet in London there are plans to close four of the nine A&E departments. Where is the logic in that?

Again the billions we send abroad in foreign aid could aid our foreigners over here and open up more A&E departments instead of closing them.

Immigration can also be blamed for over-crowding in schools where English is becoming a language of the minority. British children are being held back because most of their class-mates can't speak English. Teachers are over stretched when they find that they have at least five different languages to cope with and the problem is not helped by parents who can't and won't speak English.

The British School children should not have to learn about any other religion than Christianity unless it is as part of history or geography. Children of other faiths can learn it from their parents.
